

Bloodborne Pathogens

AIDS, Hepatitis B & C, HIV, HBV, HBC

Common Exposure

- needle sticks
- cuts from contaminated sharps, scalpels, broken glass
- contact of the eye, nose, mouth or cut/abraded skin with blood

Exposure control plan

- written
- identifies tasks that may have exposure
- describes engineering and work controls
- describes Personal Protection Equipment
- must be accessible
- must be reviewed periodically

If Exposed

- wash area with soap and water
- flush splashes to nose, mouth, or skin with water
- irrigate eyes with water or saline
- report exposure
- seek health care to determine follow up actions
